THE STILL BROTHER TRILOGY IS HERE!!!!


We are very excited to announce Stockton University's recent publication of The Kidnapped and the Ransomed: The Personal Recollection of Peter & Vina Still After Forty Years of Slavery, which is the third and last book to complete the Still Brother Trilogy. The Kidnapped and the Ransomed, originally written by Kate E. R. Pickard and published in 1856, tells of the life of Peter Still, one of Dr. James Still's older brothers who remained in bondage after their mother's successful escape from slavery.

DR. JAMES STILL COMMUNITY DAY-AUGUST 15, 2020

2020 marked our first annual Community Day in honor of Dr. James Still calling the first family reunion with his siblings in 1849. It was important to the James Still Historic Site and Education Center to extend the invitation to family as well as the community to reflect the outreach and impact of Dr. James Still's legacy. Although originally planned on-site, hosting this event virtually also proved successful. The day included musical performances, archeological and Still family history presentations, a live herbal demonstration and a virtual tour of the Education Center. Author, Don Tate, also premiered his children's book about William Still, Dr. Still's youngest brother, called William Still and His Freedom Stories: The Father of the Underground Railroad.



FIRE CIDER WORKSHOP - NOVEMBER 7, 2020



Many attendees recently enjoyed the Fire Cider Workshop presented by herbalist, Franchette Polite, a volunteer of the Dr. James Still Education Center.

Fire cider is an antiviral, anti-inflammatory, antibacterial, incredibly powerful immune boosting tonic made with herbs, roots and fruit, combined with apple cider vinegar and honey infused together to support your health during cold and flu season. The fire cider formula and name was coined by Rosemary Gladstar in the 70's. It has been reproduced, adapted and used by herbalists for years.

OFFICE STABILIZATION UNDERWAY

If you've driven by the Dr. James Still Historic Office over the past few months, you may have noticed movement on-site. The State of New Jersey's Department of Property Management and Construction has begun to stabilize Dr. James Still's office. This is the same office that Dr. James Still operated and treated hundreds of people in his time. This office was originally built in 1855 and has had several residents over the years. This project will protect the building from further

deterioration and restore original exterior features to the office. We have been working diligently with NJ DEP to see this project come about and are excited for this step in the right direction.

THERE'S AN HERB FOR THAT! HERBAL CORNER



Peppermint *(latin name: Mentha piperita)* is one of the many herbs grown on-site at the Dr. James Still Education Center. To harvest, pick and wash leaves off the peppermint plant. The stem does not have nutritional value, yet the oils are located in the leaves.

Peppermint is a natural antibacterial, antiviral, antifungal, antiseptic, cooling plant that helps with digestion, cleansing your mouth and fresh breath. It is also used in many cultures to clean palettes. As the most produced essential oil, peppermint oil is readily accessible.

There are multiple beneficial uses for peppermint. Make a tea by trimming leaves to release oils and place in hot water to help aid sleep. For congestion, mist peppermint oil in the shower or put a few drops in your hands to cup over your nose to inhale the menthol to your lower lungs. You can also create a refreshing drink placing peppermint leaves in a mixer with ginger, cucumber and lemon with the peel, as demonstrated during our Community Day.


